



Daniel B. Miller – Class of 1980

Colonel Daniel Miller, a highly-decorated Serviceman, retired in May 2014 after more than three decades of service in the United States Army. After graduating from Maumee High School in 1980, he went on to attend the United States Military Academy at West Point. Following graduation, he was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant of Armor in the United States Army. Dan served as troop commander in Operation *Desert Storm*, and he was awarded a Silver Star for his brave actions in a tank battle, known as 73 Easting. After attending Naval Postgraduate School, he served as a senior battle simulations officer in Korea where he was responsible for the planning, coordination, and execution of theater-wide simulation exercises involving over 22,000 personnel on two continents. His overseas assignments include Germany, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Iraq, Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as South Korea.

While serving in the Army, Dan was a leadership instructor at three different universities. He spent six years following his passion by teaching ROTC and USMA cadets the topics of leadership, ethics, and tactics. His instructor experience includes being an assistant professor of military science at St. John's University (Queens, NY) and the professor of military science at Capital University (Columbus, OH). While at Capital University, Miller was the director of executing a four-year Bachelor's Degree program with the objective of producing trained Second Lieutenant Officers for service in the US Army. Colonel Miller's final Army position was the Operations, Plans, and Training Officer for West Point, as well as volunteering as an Officership Instructor for West Point seniors.

Colonel Miller currently resides in Texas with his family and works for Link Simulations and Training Systems.
